




### Involving citizens in analysis

- **Topic:** climate emergency
- **Sampling approach:** TiG 'beyond the usual suspects'
- Methodology: production of easy read (data) information packs, 3 online workshops with 11 citizen analysts capturing ideas, discussions, and analysis on virtual whiteboards
- **Report:** not a consensus report. Each citizen brought their own perspective and sense-making to the information.
- Well-being Assessments: inclusion of citizen analysis
- Learning

# Involving citizens in analysis: *learning*

- A diverse group of people were convened via the Partnership's networks.
- Excellent support from Natural Resources Wales.
- Recompensing people for their time.
- Preparing a plain English/Welsh version of the data packs.
- Respectful and interesting discussions.
- Public Services Boards had a broader set of insights on climate change.
- An increased awareness, understanding and valuing of the usefulness of citizens by the Public Services Boards'.
- Ensuring data is accessible..
- Spending more time ensuring that people are data literate.
- Ensuring that the discussion was informed by *analysing* the data (appreciating and valuing the different lenses people bring to this) as opposed to discussing the topic more broadly.
- Offering a hybrid approach online and physical spaces.
- Having a longer lead-in time and time to digest the data and have deliberations.


